## Install a Rain Barrel now for later

A typical "Chicago Style" bungalow has a roof size of about 1,000 to 1,500 sq ft. During a storm in which a half-inch of rain falls, a 1,000 square foot roof will produce about 300 gallons of water. Most rain barrels only hold about 55 gallons. Install a rain barrel, collect some, use an overflow valve and hose to allow the rest to flow across your yard. Use the rain you saved to water during the next dry spell! Here are four reasons to install rain barrels at your downspouts:



- To reduce flooding in your yard or basement by storing rain water now so that you may use it in the future to water the plants in your yard.
- To save money on your water and sewage bills.
- To provide your plants with the untreated water they really need. Rain is naturally soft water and does not contain minerals, chlorine, fluoride and other chemicals.
- To help the environment by reducing the amount of water that rushes into city sewage systems and nearby streams. Using stored rain water allows it to absorb slowly into the ground replenishing our natural underground water supplies.

## Avoid the Bite of Ticks & Mosquitoes

This year, thanks to the mild winter, we will see more mosquitoes and ticks. You can help control mosquitoes before they become a problem. Regularly drain or change standing water near your home - **some mosquitoes need only a few tablespoons of water to breed**. If you use insect repellents, always **READ THE LABEL** and be sure follow the directions for correct use for yourself, on kids, on pets and around your home.

## Smashing Collection Records!

In the Fall of 2001, Will County's second annual Electronics Collection, held in Naperville, set a record of over **103,000** pounds. That record held for 15 years, unbroken until November last year when over **106,000** pounds of electronics were collected in Braidwood! However, that record only held until this year's first Saturday collection in Romeoville, where over **112,000** pounds of electronics were collected! In April, the collection at Troy Middle School topped it, taking over **121,000** pounds!



This event also set a new record for participation, with 1,551 vehicles served! Congratulations are due to all Will County residents for their dedication to the environment! Happy Earth Month!
